A goal for the Puzzle Catalogue is to reach a diverse set of audiences and we believe that a short video abstract can help to draw in a variety of readers.

What should the video abstract cover?

Please cover these four questions in your video:

- 1) Why is this theological puzzle important?
- 2) What is your hypothesis?
- 3) What are your "fields of study"?
- 4) What are the main conclusions of your puzzle?

The video should ideally be **3-5 minutes** long.

How should I record it?

You can record it either on your phone or on your laptop/computer. We would recommend using Windows Movie Maker, but any video recording software will suffice. Your are free to incorporate Powerpoint slides, for which we recommend Slideshare (http://www.slideshare.net/about).
